### Construction Starts

Construction for this project will begin in January 2012, but you may see some preparation work in the end of December. Preparation work is typically preformed by other utilities, and some by the contractor.

### Construction Method

This project will construct replace aging sewer lines under SE 11th, 12th, and Milwaukie Avenues. (see maps on reverse side) The city's contractor, Moore Excavation, Inc., will be:

- Cutting open trenches and receiving pits into the streets
- Tunneling under the railroad tracks
- Laying in new sewer pipe
- Paving
- There may be periods of inactivity during these steps

### Work Hours

Environmental Services is proposing construction hours of 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Monday through Friday. This project has been approved for 60 days of night and weekend work.

For night work construction crews will use conventional excavation equipment including backhoes, front-end loaders, and dump trucks. Generators will power the construction lights. ### What to Expect During Construction

The Railroad Crossing Project will have impacts on the surrounding community, businesses and commuters.

- **Daytime construction hours** are 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Monday through Friday. The contractor may schedule work during the same hours on Saturdays.
- Parking is prohibited in some work zones during work hours.
- Some streets will have lane restrictions during work hours, but the contractor will maintain local access at all times. You may experience delays.
- Equipment and material is secured and left on the street after work hours.
- A city construction inspector is on-site during work hours, and may be able to assist you with construction concerns. Inspectors typically wear a green safety vest and hard hat.
